FROM UNDERDOG TO WONDERDOG

Every day, we rescue, heal, and find loving homes for animals who need us the most - the sick, injured, abandoned, and abused. We serve and advocate for those with no voice, no hope, and no refuge: Those just like Bonzo, a victim of neglect so severe he almost didn't make it.

After being found running loose by a compassionate citizen earlier this year, Bonzo was rescued and quickly brought to the Humane Society of Summit County for the veterinary care and second chance he so desperately needed.

Bonzo was frightened, thin, and suffering from a horrific neck injury. His collar, over an extended period of time, had rubbed, irritated, and cut through the bottom of his neck. Bonzo was rushed into surgery. Our veterinarian delicately cleaned the infected wound and provided Bonzo with medications to ease his pain.

Unfortunately, that would not mark the end of Bonzo's struggles. Our veterinary team would find that Bonzo was also suffering from advanced heartworm disease, a dangerous infection that can lead to fatal health complications. Bonzo faced a three-month recovery at HSSC while undergoing treatment.

During the entirety of his stay at HSSC, Bonzo has been brave and resilient. His joy, playfulness, and sweet demeanor never waned, and he has quickly become a staff and volunteer favorite. Once fully healed, we are positive that Bonzo will find the family he has always deserved.

It's devastating to realize that Bonzo's ordeal was easily preventable with the most basic of care. With proper and consistent food, Bonzo would have never become thin, hungry, and weak. With a simple pet or belly rub, Bonzo's dangerously tight collar could have been realized and adjusted. With routine treatment against common parasites, he would have never contracted heartworm. Bonzo was a victim of neglect. He was lucky to have escaped.

The Humane Society of Summit County is dedicated to protecting our community's animals. We strive to not only heal and rehabilitate animals in need, but to also prevent animal neglect through community education programs. Founded by twelve men and women as Akron Area Friends of Animals for the purpose of "the inculcation of humane principles, enforcement of laws of prevention of cruelty to animals, and the protection welfare, care, health, rescue, and shelter of animals" in Summit County, Ohio.

1970s

Moved to a historical farm property on Quick Road, Peninsula within Cuyahoga Valley National Park. The new facility allowed us to shelter and care for our rescued dogs, cats, livestock, and wildlife together for the first time.

Agents were available 24/7 to respond to emergency medical calls and reports of animal cruelty (nearly 3,000 calls per month).
